### Bailey's Tea Party

### Convict Kingston Tour

Wednesday & Sunday – 1pm

Learn about World Heritage Listed Kingston. Hear about the first settlers, the Polynesians, and the first and second settlements and the facts and legends associated with each. Discover how Norfolk became home to the descendants of the infamous Bounty mutiny and walk through the historic cemetery. Refreshments provided.

### Fletcher's Mutiny Cyclorama

Daily (except Thursday) – 10.00am to 3.00pm

This amazing 360° panoramic painting is a unique way to experience the history of the Bounty adventures and discover how the world's most famous mutiny created the Pitcairn and Norfolk communities.

### For Whom The Bell Tolls

Tuesday & Friday – 11:30am

A 90 minute guided tour of the cemetery. Spanning over 200 years, the cemetery is one of the most important and unique cemeteries in Australasia. A local guide will lead you through the gravestones and the stories, providing a unique and memorable experience.

### Greenfinger Tour

Friday – 8:30am

A tour featuring some of the island's loveliest gardens. Throughout the morning visit a nursery owned and operated by a young Norfolk Islander, and view the hydroponics. Also visit a gorgeous private garden with a spectacular view. Enjoy morning tea in a scenic location.

### Horse & Carriage Ride

Daily (except Wednesday & Sunday) – 2pm

Enjoy a slow paced carriage ride through the iconic Morton Bay Fig trees, and into the Hundred Acres Reserve. After indulge in a cup of Norfolk Island Tea and some tasty treats.

### Norfolk Island Museum Pass

Monday to Saturday – 9.30am

This pass includes entry to four museums plus two museum tag-a-long tours. Learn stories of Norfolk Island, from the prehistoric Polynesian Settlement, the convict eras, and Pitcairn Islanders migration to today.

### Taste of Norfolk

Tuesday & Thursday – 1pm

Meet 3 passionate locals! First, visit a beekeepers home to view flow hives, learn about the local honeybees and taste the honey. Next, hear about the local cows that roam the roads. Learn about supplying milk for local cheesemakers, fresh milk and beef for the market place, and taste some beef sausages. Finally, watch a cooking demonstration and hear about traditional dishes handed down from Tahitian foremothers.

### The Pitcairn Settlers Village

Monday, Wednesday & Saturday 9:30am & 1:30pm

Experience the history of the Pitcairn Island Settlers. See the original Bailey homestead and gardens, stroll through the barn, dairy and out-buildings. Wander the Museum and see an Ex New Zealand Army hut, with war-time memorabilia.
